



MEETING TOPICS AND SPEAKERS


ROBIN LEVY, UHealth Executive for Business Development, UHealth Cherry Creek Medical Center – UHealth’s new medical center at 100 Cook Street (on the northeast corner of First Avenue and Cook) will offer primary care, cancer care, women’s care, state-of-the-art imaging, an outpatient surgery center, and additional specialties. Clinicians from the University of Colorado School of Medicine will care for patients at the facility, providing access to advanced medicine including clinical trials. Robin will share details and take your questions.



CHRIS HANSEN, State Representative, HD6 – Chris has an Engineering degree from Kansas State, a MS from MIT, and a PhD in Economic Geography from Oxford where he was a Research Fellow in Energy Studies, working for more renewable power in rural areas of India. Elected in 2016 and 2018 as our State House Representative, he chairs the House Committees on Climate Responsibility and Appropriations, and serves on the Joint Budget Committee. He is behind The Colorado Science and Engineering Policy Fellowship, which gives public policy experience to undergraduate and graduate students in STEM Studies, encouraging them to consider careers in policy making. He will give us a House update.



LOIS COURT, State Senator, Senate District 31 – Senator Lois Court is an experienced legislator. She earned a BA and a Master of Public Policy from UC Denver. She served as an Aide to Mayor Wellington Webb and is also an adjunct professor of American Government at Red Rocks Community College. First elected to the State House in 2008 where she served for eight years, and then elected to the State Senate in 2016 and 2018, she is currently President Pro Tempore of the Senate and will give us a legislative update.

Development, Zoning, and Construction Issues – Our Association closely reviews and monitors development plans and activities, zoning requests, and current construction work, and thus supports residents on important issues that will maintain and enhance the quality of life in our neighborhood. As a member, you will receive email updates on the current development projects.

Your Voice with the City – With a high percentage membership, our board of directors has a stronger voice with the city. In addition, through its membership in the following greater community organizations, CCNNA has access to information and a means to be heard on current issues in Denver: Inter-Neighborhood Cooperation (INC) Capitol Hill United Neighborhoods (CHUN) Cherry Creek Steering Committee (CCSC).

Crime Prevention and Awareness – Our Safety Committee works as a liaison with our District 3 Police Department for crime awareness notification and best crime prevention practices. Our Block-Builders program promotes neighbors getting to know and watch out for neighbors on a block by block basis.

Communication – All Members have the option to receive timely emails of immediate interest and importance. All email addresses are kept strictly confidential and are not released to any other party. Five **General Resident Meetings** are held each year, featuring interesting speakers and discussing important topics. This CCNNA **newsletter** is distributed five times per year.

Social Events – As a Member, you are discounted for tickets to our annual June Spring Fling party, and to Sip and Savor, our annual fall wine and food Charity Event. These provide great opportunities to meet friends, enjoy food, wine, and music in a venue within or in close proximity to Cherry Creek North.

Social Clubs and Activities – There are many resident events and common interest clubs designed to help neighbors meet each other and have fun. Examples include tapas parties, clubs for movies, books, golf, bridge and exploring Denver. (See list below.) Also, there are members only VIP tours of special museum shows and exhibits.

Lecture Series – At least once a year, CCNNA offers a lecture on a specific topic, by a local expert. These lectures are free and available only to CCNNA paid members. On February 5, Paul Ramsey of Shaver-Ramsey Rugs will host CCNNA members at his beautiful Rug Gallery (see article page 3).

Charity – CCNNA is a generous neighborhood that gives back to its community. Members are encouraged to participate in our rewarding annual (14 years!) December Salvation Army Charity Service Project, in which we volunteer a half-day to work on holiday food and gift baskets for those in need in the Greater Denver Community. Last September this event raised a total of \$5,235 which was donated equally to our Ross-Cherry Creek Branch of the Denver Library and to Urban Peak, an agency dedicated to serving homeless and at-risk youth in Denver.



CCNNA LECTURE SERIES

Everything You Ever Wanted To Know About Rugs But Were Afraid to Ask



Please join Paul Ramsey at the amazing Shaver-Ramsey Gallery, 589 Fillmore St., southwest corner of 6th Ave. and Fillmore St. on February 5 at 6:30 PM for a lecture about Middle Eastern Rugs. Wine and cheese and social time at 6:30, followed by lecture and discussion at 7:00. This free lecture is limited to 60 paid CCNNA members. To reserve your space, please go to the CCNNA website.

Paul was a founder of Shaver-Ramsey rugs which has been a fixture in Cherry Creek North since 1976. Recently, the gallery moved from its location on East 3rd Avenue to its beautiful new space on 6th Ave. Paul has traveled widely in rug-producing areas of the Middle East, mainly Turkey, Iran and Afghanistan, and speaks multiple languages. While he has shared his expertise through articles and lectures, Paul mostly enjoys discussing his knowledge, experience and enthusiasm about rugs and textiles directly with people who have interest. He will discuss the history of rugs and what makes them unique in the world. From this lecture, followed by Q&A, you will gain an increased appreciation of the beauty of these amazing works of art—their weaving, coloration and patterning. Paul is also a curator of an upcoming exhibition of Middle Eastern Rugs at the Denver Art Museum, scheduled to open in 2021.

NEW CONSTRUCTION IMPACT MITIGATION IMPLEMENTED

Over several months Councilman Wayne New with neighborhood and business leaders have pushed for improvements in Denver Public Works policies to alleviate construction project impacts on retailers and residents. On October 8th, Public Works reviewed the list of the specific issues and agreed on the following:

Parking Management and Enforcement – License plate readers have now been added for greater enforcement efficiency; salaries and benefits have been increased to encourage staff retention. Effective in January.

Construction Worker Parking Plans – In January all new proposed projects will have to provide defined parking plans for all construction workers before a building permit is granted. Compliance incentives will also be considered.

Pedestrian Sidewalk Canopies – Present regulations for pedestrian safety will be enhanced and enforced, eff. Jan.

Construction Communications – The first construction progress review meetings were held and chaired by Public Works to ensure attendance and participation by all contractors. Construction plans that may disrupt retail business and neighborhood traffic flow and affect pedestrian safety will be routine issues for discussion.

Traffic Management Plans for Street and Sidewalk Closures – Present closure policies (length of time, dimensions of streetway closed) will be evaluated. A revised policy will be initiated in January.

Intersection and Alley Signage – Residents can now request an evaluation of need for intersection and alley signage to provide greater visibility on street traffic 5 feet from alleys and 20 feet from intersections. Residents should contact 311 to request signage.

Damage to Infrastructure and Streetscape – Each current project must post a construction bond to address repairs to damaged adjacent infrastructure and streetscape. Construction bond funds have not been used in the past but will be implemented with all existing and future construction projects in January.

Construction Signage in Right of Way – Public Works will now be responsible for notifying sign companies to remove street closure, sidewalk closure, construction warning, and other construction related signage when their use is no longer needed. Residents should contact 311 on signage removal at a specific address.
