MEETING TOPICS AND SPEAKERS

HOMELESSNESS IN OUR BACKYARD? Yes, we have camps along Cherry Creek behind the Shopping Mall, and adjacent neighborhoods are also reporting similar situations. **CHRIS CONNER, current Director of Denver's Road Home**, is a former Street Outreach Caseworker for homeless youth. DRH facilitates partnerships between the City, community-based organizations, and various communities to respond to homelessness. He will provide an update on what City Parks, Police and charitable organizations are doing. And what can we do as private residents and compassionate civilians?



ANDREW HODGES, Principal, Bromwell Elementary School began his career in education teaching middle school social studies in Memphis. Hodges earned his M.Ed. of School Leadership from the Harvard Graduate School of Education in 2014. He moved to Chicago for a leadership position with Chicago Public Schools and then relocated to Denver as an assistant principal at Columbian Elementary. In June 2017, he accepted his current position as Bromwell School Principal. Bromwell is a premiere school in the DPS system and a major asset to our neighborhood. Principal Hodges will discuss Bromwell's expansion of volunteer opportunities and ways that the neighborhood, even neighbors who do not have school age children, can stay up to date and involved with the school. He will explain the school choice and enrollment process in DPS, enrollment trends and forecasts, and how these impact Bromwell. He will also describe the different improvements that have made to the school (both construction and academic/social emotional) to ensure Bromwell retains its premiere school status in Denver.



R. TONY SMITH, Marketing and Operations Director for CherryArts, has served the organization since 2000. Tony also is on the board of Capitol Hill United Neighborhoods, and has been with the 9NEWS Parade of Lights for over 10 years. He served for six years with the Denver Commission on Cultural Affairs and was recently term limited. CherryArts is most well known as the umbrella organization for the Cherry Creek Arts Festival, a 501c3 non-profit hosted by the Cherry Creek North businesses and neighbors since 1991. He will share history of the festival, provide an update regarding the upcoming festival, seek input and encourage dialogue with us. In addition, CherryArts has a year-round non-profit mission of access to art experiences and supporting year-round art education, which the community supports via the CCAF. One example is the Student Art Buying Program, through which students are given the opportunity to purchase art from the Cherry Creek Arts Festival for their school or for a mobile art gallery.

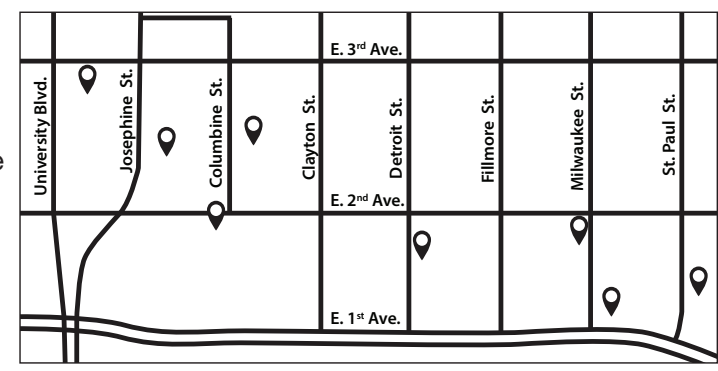
“IF YOU HEAR SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING” HAS A NEW MEANING IN CHERRY CREEK

To help us help you, we are asking you to call 311 whenever you hear especially high-decibel noise or music. If the racket is truly unreasonable, consider calling the non-emergency number for the police 720-913-2000. Complaints are filed with the Excise and License Bureau and could provide leverage when a license comes up for renewal.

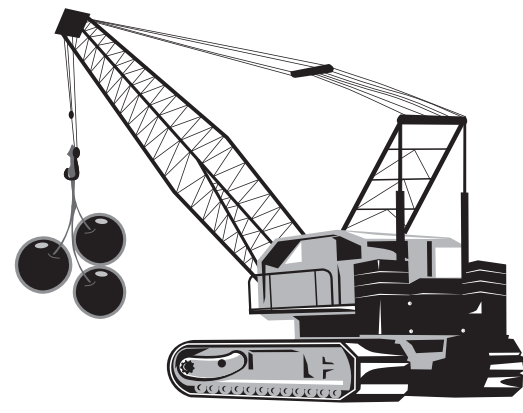
CRANES AND CONES ARE DISAPPEARING

Six of seven major building projects in Cherry Creek North are projected for completion this year! With a walk score of 95, the most walkable district in Denver has even more reasons to celebrate. As construction activity wraps up and new retail, restaurants, office and residences begin to open their doors, Cherry Creek North is solidifying its status as one of the best shopping, dining, and lifestyle destinations in the country, for both locals and tourists.

In 2017, two major building projects were completed, the MOXY Denver Cherry Creek (240 Josephine St.) and the newly redeveloped Cherry Creek Square (3000 E. 3rd Ave.). This year, the following will also be complete:

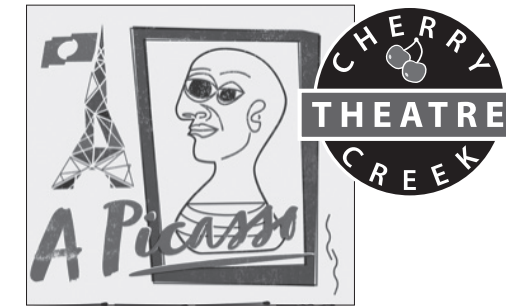
SPRING FLING— HOLD THE DATE! JUNE 13
