

Kathy's primary advocacy over the years has centered on quality of life issues: pedestrian safety; restrictions on building heights and density; parking and accessibility; events and resident participation; community building. She is the classic example of what true neighborhood activists should be: knowledgeable, passionate, involved, creative and inclusive.
