



MEET YOUR NEW CITY COUNCILMAN – CHRIS HINDS

CCNNA welcomes Councilman Hinds! Chris Hinds took over as the Councilman for Denver Council District 10 on July 15. Chris has been dedicated to public service since being paralyzed from the chest down following a motor vehicle accident in 2008. He has fought for and won on behalf of equitable access at the local, state, and national levels. He has testified in Denver and DC in front of legislative committees, been an invited speaker at seminars, and served as a subject matter expert on transportation, access, and disability topics. In May 2018, Governor Hickenlooper signed the Chris Hinds Act into law, which is a law that closes loopholes to prevent the fraudulent use of disability parking. As our new Councilman, Chris Hinds will be dedicated to making Denver a better place to live, work and play. He had advocated for the “20 minute neighborhood” where residents are able to access groceries, entertainment and transit within a 20-minute walk. We certainly have that here in Cherry Creek North and Councilman Hinds is committed to keeping the quality of life for the residents of the neighborhood. Councilman Hinds has said “I will put the needs of neighborhoods over the desires of developers. Housing should be built to last, and we need to make sure that we’re building in a way that makes sense for our neighborhoods.” He also opposed Initiative 300, believing that there are better ways for the City to address the problem of homelessness and he plans to be a part of that solution without jeopardizing Denver’s open spaces and parks. We look forward to working with Councilman Hinds as we continue to implement the Cherry Creek Area plan and the new DenverRight Blueprint Denver. With the growth of Cherry Creek under these plans and the approved zoning, we can anticipate a solid, like-minded approach to allow development under these plans while protecting the quality of life in our neighborhood.
